Ruth Milliken Mark 5:1-20 (NIV)

GOSPEL LESSON

They went across the lake to the region of the Gerasenes. When Jesus got out of the boat, a man with an evil spirit came from the tombs to meet him. This man lived in the tombs, and no one could bind him any more, not even with a chain. For he had often been chained hand and foot, but he tore the chains apart and broke the irons on his feet. No one was strong enough to subdue him. Night and day among the tombs and in the hills he would cry out and cut himself with stones.

When he saw Jesus from a distance, he ran and fell on his knees in front of him. He shouted at the top of his voice, "What do you want with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? Swear to God that you won't torture me!" For Jesus had said to him, "Come out of this man, you evil spirit!"

Then Jesus asked him, "What is your name?"

"My name is Legion," he replied, "for we are many." And he begged Jesus again and again not to send them out of the area.

A large herd of pigs was feeding on the nearby hillside. The demons begged Jesus, "Send us among the pigs; allow us to go into them." He gave them permission, and the evil spirits came out and went into the pigs. The herd, about two thousand in number, rushed down the steep bank into the lake and were drowned.

Those tending the pigs ran off and reported this in the town and countryside, and the people went out to see what had happened. When they came to Jesus, they saw the man who had been possessed by the legion of demons, sitting there, dressed and in his right mind; and they were afraid. Those who had seen it told the people what had happened to the demon-possessed man—and told about the pigs as well. Then the people began to plead with Jesus to leave their region.

As Jesus was getting into the boat, the man who had been demon-possessed begged to go with him. Jesus did not let him, but said, "Go home to your family and tell them how much the Lord has done for you, and how he has had mercy on you." So the man went away and began to tell in the Decapolis how much Jesus had done for him. And all the people were amazed.

Chapter 5:1-20 Summary

Chapter 5 begins with Jesus traveling to the region of the Gerasenes, likely a village known by the Arabic name, Kersa, on the eastern shore of the Sea of Galilee (N.A.C., vol. 23). This predominantly Gentile territory is where Jesus encounters a demoniac, a man driven insane by possession, living among the tombs (Note: tombs were considered the dwelling places of demons at the time). The demons within the man were so powerful that no chain could bind him (5:1-5). Yet, when the demoniac encounters Jesus, the Legion of Demons suddenly compose themselves. The demons recognize Jesus' authority, while at the same time begging the Lord not to torture them (5:6-10). Recognizing their defeat at hand, the demons beg Jesus to allow them to enter a heard of 2000 pigs. Jesus grants the demons permission. They enter the pigs and promptly run them off a cliff and into the lake to drown (5:11-13). The reaction of the villagers to Jesus' power was one of terror and dismay: instead of rejoicing in the man's miraculous exorcism, they ask Jesus to leave (5:14-17). The man, now free from possession, wishes to follow Jesus. Jesus, however, had another assignment for the Gentile: go and tell other Gentiles about Jesus' power and mercy (5:18-20).

Theme: Accepting the Assignment instead of Arguing Desire

The healed man desired to physically follow Jesus as a new disciple. Jesus, however, had another assignment for the man: stay on his side of the lake and share his transformation story with others.

Key Take Away: Embrace the Assignment of Jesus for your life by sharing your story of Him wherever He sends you (even if He only sends you back to your living room).
